Brainstorming means coming up with possibilities for your story. Notice I said possibilities, not perfect solutions. Don't pressure yourself to get it "right." There is no one right answer at this point. All you need to do is apply your imagination and put down a few ideas. These ideas may work out, or they may not.

Feel free to use words, phrases, sentences, symbols, diagrams, or even pictures to answer the following questions.

Courage?

Humor?

Morality?

Anger?

Sorrow?

How might the hero demonstrate self-sacrifice? (What sorts of things have you seen other people do that are sacrificial? Could your hero do anything similar?)
